You will be aware that COVID restrictions in England have now changed; in school this means that we no longer need to operate in bubbles. We are very pleased to be able to hold Collective Worship together in the hall on some days, however control measures around good hygiene, cleaning regimes, and good ventilation are still being followed.

Adults and children who test positive are still advised to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for at least five full days and then continue to follow the guidance until they have received two negative test results on consecutive days. 	Sanitary towels in larger sizes for postpartum women and breast pads
	Wet wipes, nappies (pampers in different sizes), tissues, cotton wool

- thermals/base layers
- - hot water bottles

- insulated flasks
- - baby food
- nappies
- - feminine sanitary products
- power banks (for charging phones)
- - large and medium size backpacks
- male socks
- - canned food
- dry food (pasta, rice...)
