## Spring Home Learning Plan - Week 7 - Incy Wincy Spider


Ηi,

- Make/create your very own spider, web and spout using a variety of mediums and materials.

- Use the Powerpoint attached to the email to find out some spider facts. You can talk to your child about the different parts of the spider, there is a sheet attached to the email to help with this.
- Draw a spider and label some of the body parts (you can scribe for nursery children when they name the parts)

• Make your own analogue clock? Use it to tell the time to o'clock and half past if you want to introduce that too. Time is a really difficult concept for children, this is just an introduction! Look at the clock throughout the day and talk about it with your child. This is the best way to learn time and can be carried on easily. You could also make a loose parts clock!

Write a silly sentence in your book using the oi words, use phonic knowledge to sound out words.
  ear watch the following video <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=4JSwmP61nXo">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=4JSwmP61nXo</a> Use the air phoneme roll and read mat attached to the email.
  air watch the following video <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=uZHKK9jnfFQ&t=11s">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=uZHKK9jnfFQ&t=11s</a> Use the air sheet attached to the email as a prompt, read the words, choose 8 words, draw and picture and write the word using phonic knowledge.
- This week we are exploring the concept of counting in 2s. I would suggest using pairs of socks as a resource. Use this Bitesize video as a starting point <a href="https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/clips/zw6n34j">https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/clips/zw6n34j</a> Your child could find pairs of socks/shoes or any other objects in 2s, make different amounts and count in 2s. Match the numerals to the pairs. Talk about counting in 2s as a quicker way of counting larger groups of objects. Your child could sort a group of objects- cars/animals etc into 2s and count the total in 2s. Order the numerals you would land on when counting in 2s to 10/20 (you can remind the children of the even numbers from last week and say when we count in 2s from 0 all the numbers we land on are even). You could also make a collection of 2p coins and make a mini shop pricing objects in amounts of 2, then your child has to pay using the right number of 2ps. Use the 100 square and use counters objects to cover the numbers you would land on when counting in 2s. There is also a counting in 2s cut and stick activity sheet attached to the email for your child to use along with a counting in 2s worksheet.
- Phase 3 words, practice reading and writing the second column of words on the Phase 3 High Frequency Word Mat with, for, he, them, down, me **Daily Reading and Phonics practice.**

Remember the rule for activities - 15 mins each of reading, phonics, maths and writing per day, if your child is happy to do more great but if not 15 of each is fine! Have Fun!
