<p><u>Literacy</u></p> <p>This week we are writing descriptions about places whilst using adjectives.</p> <p>Choose a picture of a setting from a book you love. List the things you can see. Imagine what you can hear there too and adjectives. E.g If looking at the Gruffalo's wood. You would see trees. So your sentence could be: Tall, twisty trees reach up to the sky. Birdsong fills the air.</p>	<p><u>Mental Maths</u></p> <p>Revise some quick double facts:</p> <p>Play throwing, catching games but instead of giving one point, double them up!</p> <p>Pass the ball back and forward counting in 2s as you go. How high can you get before you get stuck - or drop the ball.</p>	<p><u>Mathematics</u></p> <p>This week, we are still thinking about time</p> <p>Keep playing the game:</p> <p>Telling the Time in Words</p> <p>You could also set some timed 1 minute challenges: How many times can you write your name? Run around the garden? Catch a ball? Draw a horse... etc etc</p>	<p><u>Art</u></p>  <p>Place figures out on paper in the sunshine and draw around the shadow. What happens if you do it in the morning? What about in the afternoon?</p>	<p><u>Science</u></p> <p>Make a collection of flowers of different colours you see in your garden or on your walk.</p> <p>Can you find the names of them?</p>
<p><u>Spelling and Phonics</u></p> <p>Choose some words from the tricky word list.</p> <p>Write them down twice on separate pieces of paper to make a matching game.</p> <p>Write them on card and hide them. When they find them, they have to copy it using each colour of the rainbow.</p> <p>Chalk them on the wall or ground and water-pistol them off again.</p>	<p><u>Reading</u></p> <p>Keep reading and reading and reading and reading.</p> <p>Also, check out the Bookshelf Scavenger Hunt I've attached.</p> <p>Afterwards, make yourself a cosy area to read in.</p> 	<p><u>Computing</u></p> <p>If you can log on to the computer, try visiting http://Scratch.mit.edu</p> <p>Here's a tutorial I made for it:</p> <p>https://www.loom.com/share/cdc3099fc8464a25985c91e7693b4b3b</p>	<p><u>Geography</u></p> <p>Practise map making by drawing a map of where you live.</p> <p>As part of any daily exercise, try exploring different routes and add details of what you see to your map.</p> 	<p><u>Religious Education</u></p> <p>Through Bible stories this year, we have thought a lot about what God is.</p> <p>Here's a question to consider.</p> <p>Can Christians pray to God when the churches are closed?</p> <p>Can you think of any Bible stories that might help explain your thinking.</p>
