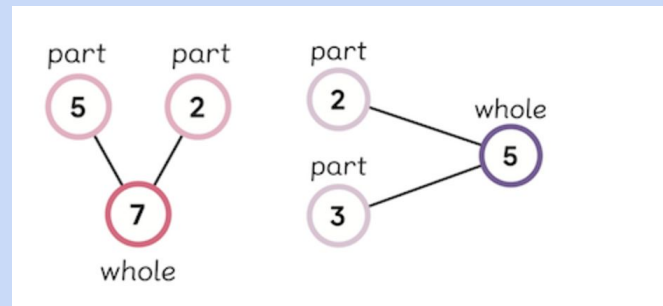

**Part, Part Whole**

These are examples of part, part whole models. We can use the 3 numbers in each model to write 4 calculations.

If  $5 + 2 = 7$

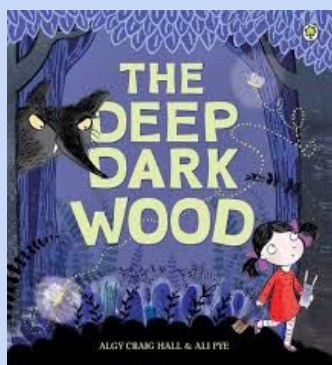
Then,  $2 + 5 = 7$

And  $7 - 5 = 2$  Also  $7 - 2 = 5$



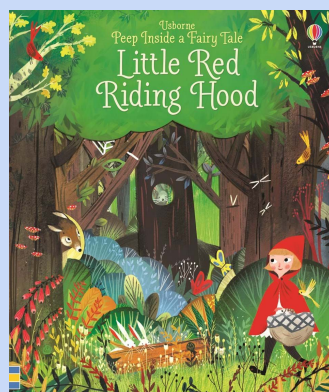
**Pacific Northwest Art**

Pacific Northwest Art refers to western coast of Canada where the art of peoples of First Nations cultures originated and continues. Many stories from the First Nations regions are about animals and many lessons are learnt from them. They are the inspiration for most of the artwork. The artwork begins with a formline - a thick black outline. It is then filled with different shapes that are white or red in colour these include ovoids (like a rounded rectangle), u form shapes (like a u or v) and L shapes.



**Fiction Text**

**Fiction Text**

From this traditional tale, we will be looking at the following features of grammar and punctuation:

**exclamations** - sentences that start with 'What' or 'How' as in 'What big eyes you have!'

**adjectives** - used to describe a noun such as 'Big Bad' or 'Little Red'.



**Wolves**

Wolves are the largest members of the dog family. The grey wolf has been the notorious villain of fables and fairy stories for centuries, yet this highly intelligent and sociable animal has done little to warrant its terrifying reputation. Once widespread throughout North America, Europe and the Far East, the grey wolf is, sadly, now only found in large numbers in specific parts of the USSR, North America and Eastern Europe. When hunting as a pack they prey on much larger animals, including deer, elk, and moose. Wolves also eat smaller mammals such as birds, fish, lizards, snakes, but also eat fruit.

**Peter and the Wolf**

This is a musical composition written by **Sergei Prokofiev** in 1936. The narrator tells a children's story, while the **orchestra** illustrates it. Each character of this tale is represented by a corresponding instrument in the orchestra: the bird by a flute, the duck by an oboe, the cat by a clarinet playing staccato in a low register, the grandfather by a bassoon, the wolf by three horns, Peter by the string quartet, the shooting of the hunters by the kettle drums and bass drum.

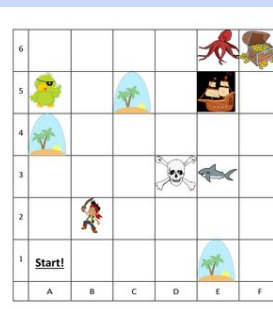


**Christian Creation Story**
